

### A Sandy Beach in the City's South End

In December, the Mobil Oil Company donated 7.8 acres to the City of Burlington, including 800 feet of beautiful sandy beach next to Oakledge Park. The Bond will pay for the clean-up of the beach so that residents and visitors can better enjoy bathing and beautiful views. The shallow shore area will be good for young children. Parking and toilet facilities at Oakledge will be carefully improved.








### Protection for Leddy Beach in the City's North End

Leddy Beach in the City's North End has lost over 50 feet of shoreline to Lake Champlain in the past five years due to wave action caused by heavy winter storms. Critical shoreline protection at Leddy Beach will protect one of the City's most beautiful beaches from further erosion. The Bond will also pay for improving the accessroad to the beach, which is used by cars carrying "car-top" boats, sailboards, and canoes.




## Better Fishing & Boating Access

Many of Burlington's residents enjoy fishing and boating on beautiful Lake Champlain. The Bond will pay for a variety of improvements which will substantially increase Burlington residents' access for boating and fishing. These include:

- Building of a Community Boathouse. People will be able to rent smallboats of all types at a reasonable cost. During the winter months, the Boathouse will provide a warm shelter for skaters, skiers, and winter-fun enthusiasts. The Boathouse will also function as a year-round center for community events and activities, such as classes for boating, sunset concerts, and public meetings. The construction of the Community Boathouse will be complemented by the improved water quality in the inner harbor.
- Creating anew boating access ramp at the site of the Moran Generating Station. This will help alleviate traffic and congestion at Perkin's Pier during the summer's busiest weekends.
- Improving access for cars carrying "car top" boats, such as sailboards, canoes, and row boats at "Mobil Beach" at Oakledge Park, and at Leddy Beach.
- Improving access to Perkin's Pier, the College Street Point, and the Moran Station site, for those of us who want to simply "throw a line into the water."





# We'll Finish & Improve the Bike Path!

Burlington's Bike Path is enjoyed by thousands of City residents, both old and young alike. Improvements to the Bike Path will include:

- A widening and repaving of the Bike Path in the City's New North End, in the area north of Leddy Park.
- Overall, general improvements to the Bike Path, including additional landscaping and park benches.
- Modest improvements to the northern terminus of the Bike Path at the mouth of the Wingoski River.
- Construction of the missing section from the Barge Canal area to the Lakeside neighborhood to complete the 9 mile Lakeshore Bike Path.
- Connection of the Bike Path along city streets from Oakledge Park to the Southern Connector.
- And finally, planning and engineering for the completion of a 36-mile Bike Path Loop around the City.

#### Long-Range Planning on the Waterfront

The City has recently adopted new Zoning for the waterfront. But zoning is only one method of insuring reasonable development for the downtown waterfront areas. The Bond will pay for more detailed urban design, analysis and planning of infrastructure requirements, transportation systems planning and drafting additional land-use management controls. This work will ensure the appropriate conservation and development of the urban waterfront as an attractive extension of our City.



## **Better Downtown Waterfront Parks**

The City of Burlington owns and controls some of the most beautiful waterfront lands on Lake Champlain. Many of them are underutilized and need repair and improvements. The Waterfront Bond will increase public access and enjoyment of these downtown waterfront areas:

- Perkin's Pier, including better parking, repair of the bulkheads, a children's playground, and a beautiful new boardwalk area.
- College Street Point, including landscaping, picnic tables and benches, and shoreline protection.
- Roundhouse Point, including landscaping, tables and benches, and the creation of a new sandy beach!
- Moran Station site, including the renovation of the picnic pavilion at the Water Resources building, landscaping and other amenities
